## **Important Information**

#### Visuals

Do not take the original visuals or Bible information out of the Bible curriculum. Always photocopy the originals. The originals must never be used. This is in order that:

- 1. The original can be used as a color page as well as made into a visual aid.
- 2. If a visual is ever lost or destroyed, then you will still have the original picture in the curriculum so that a new visual can be made.

#### Explanation of the visual numbers

- 1N = NEOS Bible Curriculum 1
- 2N = NEOS Bible Curriculum 2

For example, picture 2N8 comes from Book 2 and it is picture number 8 in Book 2.

## **Activity Choices**

At the end of many of the lessons, you will see the words "Activity Choices."

- <u>Color page</u>: If you choose to do a color page, simply make additional photocopies of the visual for the lesson you will be teaching. Make enough copies so that there is one for each student. Make sure that there are crayons or colored pencils available for the students to use so they can make their pictures look nice.
- <u>Picture Bible</u>: Give each student a folder. Have each student decorate the outside of the folder according to the lessons you will be teaching. For example, if you will be teaching the lessons on the life of Noah, then the students will decorate the front of the folder with the word, 'Noah,' plus the drawing of an ark and some animals. Then, during each class session, the students will color one page to be put into their picture Bible. At the end of all of the lessons on Noah, the teacher will fasten the color pages into the folders and the students will take the picture Bibles home. The students may use the picture Bibles to tell their friends and family the Bible stories they have learned in your classes.
- <u>Review game</u>: If you choose to do a review game, prepare a simple game using the Bible Story Review Game ideas from Books 1 and 2.

### Games

- <u>Bible Verse Games</u> are used to help you teach a new Bible verse to the students. They will also be useful as you review the verses each week. Reviewing the verses often will help the students learn the verses well.
- <u>Bible Story Review Games</u> are used to help you review the Bible stories and Bible verses that have already been taught to the students. It is nice to play a Bible story review game at the end of each class session. The games make the class fun, but more important, they also are the way the students will really learn what is taught during each class session.
